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WELCOME TO THE 2025 EISTEDDFOD

A very warm welcome to the 2025 Devizes Eisteddfod, our 79th year, in which we build on the major changes to our programme introduced last year.

Our November Music, Speech and Drama festival runs over five days this year (see Festival Calendar on page 5) and has been organised in response to information received from teachers and parents. Where possible we have tried to avoid clashing classes this year so that all performers can be present at their class adjudications.

Last year the Eisteddfod enjoyed a 53% increase in the number of performances given. This was very much due to the considerable rise in the number of schools who are now Partners of the Eisteddfod, some 35 organisations in 2024. We hope this figure will increase still further in 2025. (see page 37)

Our range of classes continues to expand with new categories and timings added in both music and speech/drama areas, introduced in response to suggestions from our supporters.

This year there will again be two post-Eisteddfod concerts. A Junior Showcase, for those performers who have done especially well aged 11 & under, and the Festival Concert, principally for senior students. Both concerts will be held on Saturday, 22 November 2025, the Junior Showcase at 2.30pm and the Festival Concert at 7pm. Entry to each concert will be £5 adults with children/students free.

This year there has again been considerable interest in our Creative Arts programme: the entry period for the 2026 Creative Arts Festival will be from Monday, 1 December 2025 until Friday, 30 January 2026 at 5pm.

No brief welcome could omit to mention our two key Eisteddfod partners: our sponsor Wansbroughs Solicitors and Devizes Town Council who continue to help in so many ways to make it possible for us to continue to develop the Eisteddfod: to both organisations the festival is extremely grateful.

We look forward to welcoming you in November.

HOW TO ENTER THE FESTIVAL

Entry is made ONLINE only. Go to www.devizes-eisteddfod.org.uk

Click on the Music/Speech & Drama discipline page where you will find the **ENTRY FORM**.

Booking opens on Tuesday, 1 July 2025.

Entries will close at 2200 on Friday, 3 October.

When paying entry fees please remember to quote the reference number which you will receive when your entry is acknowledged.

PARTNERSHIP SCHOOLS:

Be sure to enter your partnership reference number before entering performers' names.

AGE LIMITS

All performers in **competitive** classes must be aged 18 or under on **Monday, 1 September 2025**. The Eisteddfod reserves the right to refuse any entry.

Adult performers may take part in the **Non-Competitive Classes only.**

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

Except for the Non-Competitive Classes, no entrant may enter more than once in the same class: this also applies to duets, groups, and ensembles.

SCHOOL ENTRIES

Solo performers and members of groups entered as a school must be pupils of the school on the day of performance at the Eisteddfod.

ENTRY FEES

Entry fees cannot be refunded other than under exceptional circumstances.

GENERAL INFORMATION

OFFICIAL ACCOMPANISTS

Official accompanists are available for all music classes but **must be requested in advance on the entry form.** A fee of £3.00 per performance will be charged and is non-refundable. Performers may be able to arrange a rehearsal before the Eisteddfod at a fee to be arranged privately. A copy of the music to be performed must be sent to the Entry Manager when the entry is made and no later than **Friday 3 October 2025.** Copies should be marked clearly with the performer's name and class number. Please indicate the speed required by adding (or altering) a metronome mark. If submitting a photocopy please ensure it is in playable format (no staples please). The published copy must be available for the accompanist on the day of the class. Accompanists' contact details will sent to all applicants requesting an official accompanist. **The Eisteddfod reserves the right to refuse to accept certain items of repertoire if the complexity of the music is such that accompanist preparation time would be too long. Partner schools may request a visit from an official accompanist. Performers are, of course, very welcome to provide their own accompanist.**

DATA PROTECTION

The Eisteddfod will hold data contained on the entry forms for the purpose of administering the festival and will not pass on any information to third parties. Please refer to page 38 for further information.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

Electrical equipment/mobile phones may be provided by the performer and can be used as an accompaniment for all classes. Equipment must be pre-tested and approved safe (PAT tested) and marked to that effect. This applies to anything that requires a mains socket. Set up time must be before the start of the class.

PROGRAMMES

Programmes will be available for collection from Wansbroughs Solicitors, Northgate House, Northgate SN10 1JX and Devizes Books, Sidmouth Street, SN10 1LD from **Wednesday, 5 November 2025** and will cost £3.00. They will also be available at the Eisteddfod. If you would like a programme posted to you, please fill in the relevant box on the online entry and include the additional postage and packing costs of £2.50.

ADJUDICATION

In all cases the adjudicator's decision will be final. All written communication regarding adjudication matters must be addressed to the Director via the website. In all questions and disputes the Executive Committee's decision will be final. Any immediate issues must be addressed to an Eisteddfod steward.

Communication with the adjudicator in all classes is strictly forbidden.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ORDER OF PERFORMANCE

The order of performance is decided by the entry team and for ease of timetabling. The Executive Committee reserves the right to make minor alterations, including sub-dividing classes, for the smooth running of the event.

TIME LIMITS

Performers will not be placed if the time limit is exceeded and the performance may be stopped at the discretion of the adjudicator.

CLASS TIMES

Times of classes and venues will be sent via email to all applicants no later than **Thursday, 16 October 2025.** Please note the organisers will endeavour to programme the festival as shown on the calendar on page 5 but they reserve the right to make changes if circumstances become unavoidable.

CERTIFICATES & COMMENTS SHEETS

All performers will receive a certificate and comments sheet. These must be collected from the adjudicator's clerk **at the end of each class**. The Executive Committee will endeavour to have the full list of results available one hour after the end of each class although this cannot always be guaranteed. Results will be displayed upstairs in the Town Hall Foyer for all competitive performance classes. Any performance certificates and comments sheets not collected at the end of the class will be sent to the **Eisteddfod Office** in the Town Hall Council Chamber (during the festival only). Those certificates and comments sheets not collected by the end of the festival will be sent to Wansbroughs Solicitors, Northgate House, Northgate, Devizes SN10 1JX for collection from **Monday, 17 November** until **Friday, 28 November**. Any paperwork not collected by 28 November will be destroyed.

AWARD CATEGORIES

Results will be shown by means of categories. Award categories are not issued for non-competitive classes.

All performers in competitive classes will receive a certificate showing one of the following categories: **Developing, Progressing, Merit, Commended, Honours, Outstanding and Exceptional**.

GENERAL INFORMATION

EISTEDDFOD OFFICE

The Eisteddfod Office will be open on **November 14-16 only** and can be found upstairs in the Devizes Town Hall. Please note this is for adjudicators and stewards to report and urgent issues only. All performers should go directly to the venue of their class. All information required by performers can be found in the Eisteddfod Programme.

EISTEDDFOD FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME

To make access to the Eisteddfod as affordable as possible, the Executive Committee may be able to help with the cost of class entry and/or transport costs directly related to participation in the 2025 event. If your school/child/ student would like financial help with entering or getting to the event, please send an email stating why you have a need to the Director by **Monday 7 July 2025**. Applications will be considered by the Committee after that date and available funds will be shared and distributed as soon as possible.

JUNIOR SHOWCASE 2025

A Junior Showcase will take place in the Devizes Town Hall Assembly Room on **Saturday, 22 November 2025 at 2.30pm**. The concert will include some of the outstanding performances given by performers aged 11 & under during the Eisteddfod. Invitations to perform in this event will be sent out at the end of the Eisteddfod.

Admission: adults £5, children free – available at the door on the day only.

FESTIVAL CONCERT 2025

The Festival Concert will take place in the Devizes Town Hall Assembly Room on **Saturday**, **22 November at 7pm**. In addition to the presentation of major awards the concert will include some of the outstanding performances from this year's Eisteddfod. Participation in the concert is by invitation from the Director and Committee based on advice from our adjudicators and to give a balanced flavour of the overall event. Invitations will be sent out at the end of the Fisteddfod.

Admission: adults £5, children free – available at the door on the day only.

RULES FOR MUSIC CLASSES

GENERAL GUIDANCE

In those classes where a standard rather than an age is indicated, performers are expected to enter the class appropriate to their current standard, regardless of age. Pieces do not have to be from a current examination list in graded classes, which merely indicate the standard expected.

ACCOMPANIMENT

Please see page 7 under the sections Official Accompanists and Electrical Equipment.

PERFORMANCE

It is required that performers announce their chosen piece before presentation which adds to the enjoyment of the audience. Please note that introductions and tuning must be included in the time limit. Music must be made available for the adjudicator before the start of the class. Music stands will be provided.

ADJUDICATOR COPIES

A copy of the music to be performed must be provided for the Adjudicator on the day.

TIME LIMITS

The time limits stated are maximum limits not minimum. Introductions and tuning must be included in the time limit. A performance may be stopped if it exceeds the allocated time limit.

CLASS SIZES

The Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of entries in any class or subdivide a large-entry class in order to facilitate timetabling on the day or to merge very small classes where appropriate.

COPYRIGHT

The use of photocopies or other facsimile copies of printed music without the publisher's permission is forbidden and against the law. A copy may be made for the adjudicator provided the performer has an original copy of the music available on the day. The photocopy will be retained and then destroyed by the Executive Committee. No arrangement of music still under copyright is permitted, unless with written consent of the publisher.

Failure to comply with the Music Rules may result in the performance being adjudicated but, in competitive classes, not placed.

What information do we collect about you?

We collect information about you when you register to compete in the Eisteddfod, apply to become a member of the Eisteddfod/Friend of the Eisteddfod or volunteer as a steward and also if you voluntarily complete surveys or give feedback. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the Eisteddfod. We do not collect 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information about you in order to process your entry to classes in the Eisteddfod and for any other administrative functions of the Eisteddfod. Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Eisteddfod.

Access to your data and correction

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained, without charge, by application to the Director at (email: director@devizes-eisteddfod.org.uk)

We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

The Devizes Eisteddfod seeks to provide performance opportunities for children and young people each year. We are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Committee Members, Volunteers and paid Adjudicators.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount.
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse.
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our event.
- to provide volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing or be at risk of harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them.
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made.
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers.
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know and involving parents and children appropriately.

The Devizes Eisteddfod uses the following procedures to create a safer Eisteddfod for everyone:

- 1.One designated Eisteddfod Safeguarding Officer (ESO) Name: Pam Jolley
- 2.Best practice advice in the form of Eisteddfod Child Protection leaflets, with support for all Eisteddfod volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 3. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Eisteddfod volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at the Eisteddfod.
- 4.All Eisteddfod personnel wear an official badge. All teachers/parents/guardians /carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge.
- 5.For the duration of the Eisteddfod all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Eisteddfod venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. Single sex changing facilities will be provided where necessary. The Eisteddfod cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- 6.No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at the Eisteddfod. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 7.Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Entry Manager at the time of entry. The Eisteddfod actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 8. The Eisteddfod's Child Protection Policy is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Eisteddfod.
